Class Spotlight

Jane Classen Simon (1960 Secretary): I have received and sent out news of my classmates to a list-serve for the Radcliffe Class of '60 for the last ten years (since the Radcliffe Quarterly was abolished in about 2010). The current concern of many of my classmates relates to the changing name of the Radcliffe Institute, now the Harvard-Radcliffe Institute. Those of us who were accepted into, lived at, and graduated from Radcliffe are saddened to see the name of our college slowly being undermined. Given the past history of Harvard's disregard for Radcliffe (I could name several examples), we can't help but wonder how long it will be before "Radcliffe" disappears entirely.

Cynthia Blanton (1971 Secretary): Class of '71 has been busy resisting the renaming of the Radcliffe Institute to Harvard Radcliffe Institute. We have written various letters to Dean Brown-Nagin and President Bacow, politely questioning the process whereby this occurred, only to receive formulaic responses, claiming that alumni/ae were part of the decision, and by the way the Institute is described as a "school" of Harvard. Please pass on this link to your class members so they can sign the petition expressing our outrage, though politely, at this erasure of Radcliffe's history, legacy, and ideals. We currently have 228 signatures. On a happier note, we are planning our breakaway 50th Reunion for next year after resisting HAA suggestions that we hold it this year virtually.

Rod Kessler (1971 Secretary): Members of the Class of 1971 have started to gather for group lunches (in person!) once again not only in Boston but also in New York, Philadelphia, San Francisco, and (soon) Atlanta. We're also planning to party in Cambridge next June to celebrate our 51st — and make up for not having had an in-person 50th.

Joan Porter Maclver (1975 Secretary): The Radcliffe Class of 1975 will be launching an Oral History Project to record the oral histories from class members as we approach our 50th Reunion. Entering college as members of the last class to be outnumbered 4 to 1 by Harvard men, the women in the Class of '75 experienced Radcliffe and Harvard during a key moment of these institutions' histories. We seek to capture classmates' memories and thoughts of these tumultuous, if little studied, years at the University, and how our college experiences prepared us for subsequent lives and careers. Interviews will be conducted largely by classmates. Funding will be provided by the Class of '75, and digital copies of the video interviews and records, along with transcriptions, will be deposited at the Schlesinger Library. Our class also has a new class project, PassTheMic75, a podcast by our classmates about our '75 classmates and a monthly program of Marching Towards Justice, along with other class activities — outcomes of a successful 45th Zoom Reunion.

Margarita Montoto (1978 Secretary): ClassAct HRX8 continues to grow in membership and projects. Founded by members of HR78, HR88 has joined in and added a project to collaborate with. View our website for news <u>here</u>.

Claire Mays (1981 Secretary): Radcliffe lives. This spring the 40th Reunion class received an alert from the 50th Reunion class, pointing to the effective renaming of the Radcliffe Institute for Advanced Study to "Harvard Radcliffe Institute". 253+ class of '81 signatories agreed that "we understand; it's branding. 'Harvard TH Chan...,' 'Harvard Paulson...,' 'Harvard Kennedy School....' A suite of 'Harvard' products. Radcliffe, though, doesn't need the Harvard name tag to validate its unique history and singular contributions to promoting women, scholars, and scholarship." 1981 co-secretaries and treasurer signed the cover letter directing our petition to Dean Brown-Nagin and President Bacow. The alert has fostered intensive interclass communication and a coalition of 10 classes ranging from 1951 to 1981. We request and await dialogue — so far not on the Dean's agenda, sad to say.

Gabrielle Burton (1992 Secretary): We are gearing up for our 30th next June, and so are beginning to spread the word about the date changes for reunions, and also to get classmates involved in the planning. Facebook and class-wide emails seem the most effective means for reaching our class, and our plan is to host regular Zooms leading up to reunion to encourage participation both in coming back to campus, as well as to widen participation for those who can't travel to Cambridge that weekend. Zoom topics will include a book chat discussion with authors, another on leadership, another on power dynamics and intimate partner violence and what we all can do about it, and another aimed at organizing us together to do a public service act.
